English, World History or AP Human Geography, Biology, and Math (typically Algebra or Geometry) are required for freshmen.

One period of lunch and one period of ASP are also required for freshmen.

Most freshmen have two periods per day for elective classes (electives are offered in Art, Music, Business, Industrial Ed, Family and Consumer Sciences, World Languages, and English).

Incoming freshmen can take World History in summer school to open up a third elective slot during the school year (assuming the student passes this course).

This is especially useful for the following scenarios:

- Music students wishing to take world language and another elective in addition to music.
- AVID students wishing to take world language and another elective in addition to AVID.

Many university programs require four years of world language for admittance.

Notes

The following classes are available to incoming freshmen in summer school:

- Art Fundamentals (this course is a required prerequisite for all other art courses).
- World History (this is an excellent option for students that wish to take an additional elective as a freshman).
- Automotive Technology 1.
- Culinary Arts 1.

Some students will be recommended for a double period of Algebra I. This is typically for students that were unsuccessful in 8th grade math. Please be aware that the double-period Algebra I class takes one of the available elective slots for freshmen.

Some students will be recommended for a period of reading support. This is typically for students that scored low on the 8th grade standardized tests in reading, and/or students that are recommended for additional reading support by their 8th grade teacher. Please be aware that the reading support class takes one of the available elective slots for freshmen.
