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Introduction

The Basics

District 300 will implement a Remote Learning instructional approach for the first quarter of the 2020-2021 academic year (August 17, 2020 through October 9, 2020).

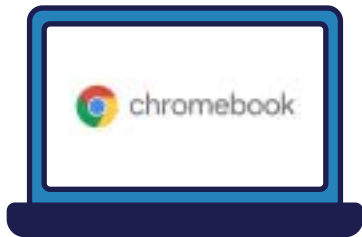
During Remote Learning, students will learn from home while engaging in instructional activities through their district-issued Chromebooks.

Students will participate in synchronous (live) lessons Mondays through Thursdays and asynchronous (not live) lessons on Fridays.

Remote Learning: Useful Terms

During Remote Learning, District 300 students will use the following technology hardware and software:



Chromebook: A computer issued to all District 300 students from kindergarten through 12th grade. All students have received a new Chromebook for the 2020-2021 academic year. The software students will need to participate in Remote Learning has been preloaded onto the device.



RapidIdentity: District 300's single sign-on provider allowing students and parents to log in and access multiple applications, including PowerSchool Learning and Zoom.



PowerSchool Learning (Formerly Haiku): The district's learning management system. PowerSchool Learning is the central hub where all students will find items provided by their teachers, including agendas, assignments, instructions, and messages.



Zoom: The video conferencing platform students will use to engage in synchronous (live) instruction Mondays through Thursdays. Zoom can also be used for meetings between teachers and families and to provide certain types of therapies and accommodations.

If a student **can** access PowerSchool Learning (Formerly Haiku): The student or parent can submit a “Student Help Desk Ticket” in the Student 1:1 Help Desk in PowerSchool Learning.

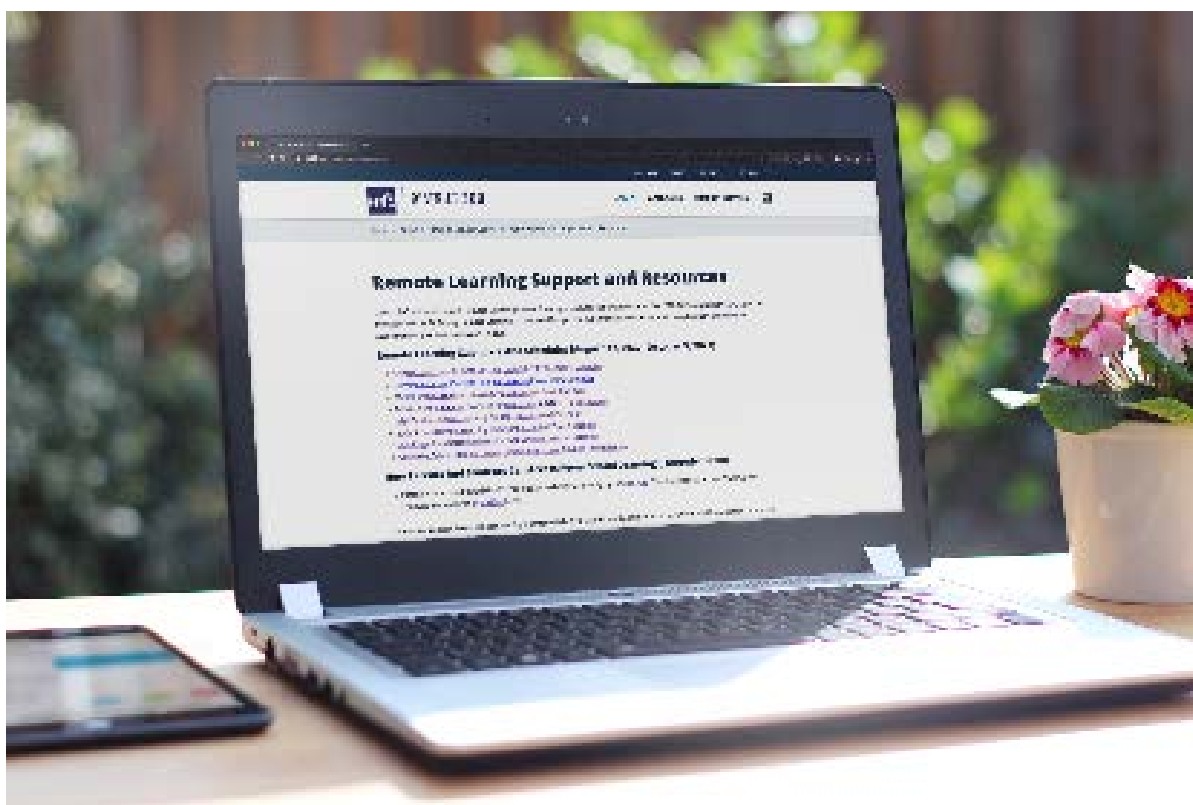
- **For students in grades 6th through 12th:** After receiving a help desk ticket, a Digital Learning Coach will email 6th through 12th grade students directly to provide support.
- **For students in kindergarten through 5th grade:** After receiving a help desk ticket, a Digital Learning Coach will work with a student’s teacher or the family to provide support.

If a student **cannot** access PowerSchool Learning (Formerly Haiku):

- **For students in grades 6th through 12th:** students can call their school’s media center (via the school’s main office phone number) or they can email District 300’s Director of Innovation and Digital Learning, Anne Pasco, at anne.pasco@d300.org.

Remote Learning Instruction

Students will engage in two types of remote learning instruction, synchronous (live) lessons Mondays through Thursdays and asynchronous (not live) lessons on Fridays.

Synchronous Learning (Mondays Through Thursdays)

Synchronous Learning (Live): refers to a learning event in which a group of students engages in learning at the same time. The staff member is teaching students in real-time.

District 300 students will participate in synchronous learning Mondays through Thursdays.

Step-by-Step Process for Students to Participate in Synchronous Learning:

Step 1: Turn on Chromebook

Step 2: Log into RapidIdentity (if you cannot log in, please request a password reset using the form available at d300.org/RemoteTechSupport)

Step 3: Log into your PowerSchool Learning class for your assigned teacher to check your daily agenda

Step 4: Follow your teacher's direction for logging into the Zoom app and authenticate the student account to begin live instruction. If a student cannot log in to Zoom, they should submit a ticket to the Student 1:1 Help Desk in PowerSchool Learning.

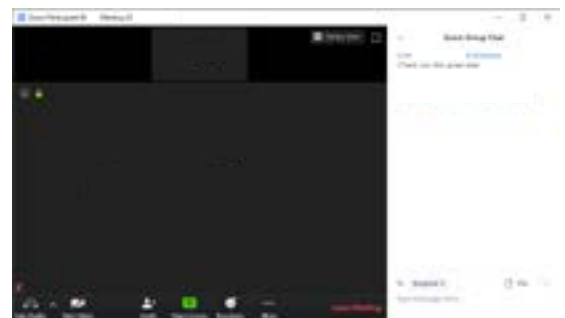

Asynchronous Learning (Fridays)

Asynchronous Learning (Not Live): is the concept that students learn the same material at different times and locations. This includes pre-posted lessons or recorded and posted lessons.

District 300 students will engage in asynchronous learning on Fridays.

While students will not participate in a live classroom session on asynchronous learning days, they are expected to log in every Friday at 9 a.m. (unless they have an earlier scheduled appointment with the teacher) to see if any new assignments have been assigned.

Students who fail to log in on asynchronous days will be marked absent.

During asynchronous days, students will follow-up with students who require assistance, have been absent, are missing assignments, or failing to participate in class. Teachers may also schedule time for students to complete labs, assessments, or other activities.

Step-by-Step Process For Students to Access Asynchronous Lessons:

Step 1: Turn on Chromebook

Step 2: Log into RapidIdentity (if you cannot log in, please request a password reset using the form available at d300.org/RemoteTechSupport)

Step 3: Log into PowerSchool Learning and view your daily agenda by 9 a.m.

Step 4: **Elementary school students** should view the agendas for their homeroom teachers and specials teachers. **Middle school and high school students** should view the agendas for all their assigned classes.

Special Education Students

All students with IEPs will participate in Remote Learning starting August 17.

Students in LEAP, SOAR, LIFE, Multi-Needs, L.D., Self-Contained, and 300 Plus programs who have opted to return to in-person learning will return after Labor Day. In-person instruction will occur Mondays through Thursdays. On Fridays, students will participate in asynchronous learning from home.

Students in LEAP, SOAR, LIFE, Multi-Needs, L.D., Self-Contained, and 300 Plus programs who did not opt to return to in-person instruction, will continue with Remote Learning through October 9, 2020.

Students attending therapeutic schools (such as Parkland, Camelot, and Glen Oaks) should follow their school's reopening procedures.

Students who have related services on their IEPs can schedule walk-in services with their therapists. Parents will need to provide transportation and follow all district safety procedures.
