English, World History or AP Human Geography, Biology, and Math (typically Algebra I or Geometry) are required for freshmen.

One period of lunch and one period of ASP are also required for freshmen.

Most freshmen have two periods per day for elective classes (electives are offered in Art, Music, Business, Industrial Education, Family and Consumer Sciences, World Languages, and English).

Incoming freshmen can take Honors World History in summer school to open up a third elective period during the school year (assuming the student passes the summer course).

This is especially useful for the following scenarios:

- Music students wishing to take world language and another elective in addition to music.
- AVID students wishing to take world language and another elective in addition to AVID.

Many university programs require four years of world language for admittance.

Notes

- During the 2019 Summer School program, Honors World History is available for incoming freshmen.
- Some students will be recommended for a double period of Algebra IB. This is typically for students that were unsuccessful in 8th grade math. Please be aware the double-period Algebra IB class takes one of the available elective slots for freshmen.
- Some students will be recommended for a period of reading support. This is typically for students that scored low on the 8th grade standardized tests in reading, and/or students that are recommended for additional reading support by their 8th grade teacher. Please be aware the reading support class takes one of the available elective slots for freshmen.
- High school counselors are available to discuss scheduling options in detail and will visit each D300 middle school and D300's community charter, parochial, and private schools in February. Students can bring questions to their individual meeting.
